# John Harris, EMT-B Opens Uniform Store!

When Village Ambulance Service Emergency Medical Technician John Harris decided to start a business to supply Berkshire County police officers, firefighters and EMTs, he didn't want to sell just uniforms.

He saw the business as more of a convenience store that would supply all kinds of equipment for emergency services personnel. United Uniforms, which opened on June 24, is based on that idea.

"I know how hard it is to get the gear you're looking for if you're police, fire or EMS," Harris said at his shop, which is located on Route 8. "Not only that, but I know a lot about the safety and the protection measures that the equipment brings. I got the idea to have a little convenience store for all the emergency services -- even nurses. There's nowhere like that in our area that has all of that. We're even working on uniforms for Boy Scouts and Girl Scouts."

The shop is located at 1617 South State Road. Business has been steady, Harris said.

Besides uniforms, the shop features



additional protective and safety gear such as hats, jackets, shirts, pants, vests, boots and firefighter turnout gear. United Uniform is a registered dealer for 25 different emergency services equipment companies. It also provides accessories like utility knives, outdoor gear and stethoscopes. Harris has invested some \$70,000 in capital into the business, and plans to invest more.

United Uniforms is open from 10 a.m. to 6 p.m. Mon - Fri from 11 a.m. to 6 p.m. on Saturday. It is closed on Sundays. For more information on United Uniforms call (413) 743-0020.

## "First Aid-for-First Aid"

As you may already know from recent local press coverage, every home in the Spruces Mobile Home Park, Williamstown, MA, has been ruled uninhabitable by the building inspector, and nearly 300 elderly residents have been seeking alternative housing.

According to Town Officials, wet electrical systems, flooded homes and spilled petroleum products caused by the overflowing Hoosic River during Tropical Storm Irene threaten the park's safety. All of the 226 homes are conditionally uninhabitable; therefore, nearly 300 people who live at the park will be staying with family or friends. However, there are at least 10 people that town officials know have nowhere else to go.

The common mission of the Village Ambulance Service and United Uniforms fundraising venture, "First Aid-for-First Aid" was simple - raise as much money as possible to aid in the Spruces Mobile Home Park rebuilding process. We included in our mission assisting those residents who not only need to rebuild their homes, but the community they once relied on as their sole social and networking outlet.

Because of this, Village Ambulance Service and United Uniforms, Cheshire, held a "First Aid-for-First Aid" fundraising event at the Berkshire Mall on September 3 & 4. Members from each organization collected from mall-goers from 1 p.m. to 4 p.m. using empty first aid bags. The project raised just under \$5000.00 which will directly go to the Spruces Hurricane Relief Fund.
